Scratch marks identified on trunks of Eucalyptus major which sheds its bark every year. | The rear portions of the blocks of residential land backing onto 154 Horizon Dv are covered by VPOs to protect the bushland and should be included in land protected for koala use. |

Further research required on koala use. |
| 4.2 | Jamboree Heights State School (information added 27-Feb-09) | Beanland St and Naver St | Jamboree Heights | 197 | H9-I9 | Lot 1 RP193249 | Koalas were seen in the school grounds about 6 years ago. | Important connection exists through BCC parkland to McLeod Golf Course (see #18), Peter Lightfoot Oval to 154 Horizon Dv bushland and through Mt Ommaney Creek bushland to the Brisbane River ecological corridor. Further research required on koala use. |

NOTES:

- a) Koalas have been sighted in various areas of the Centenary suburbs or their scratchings have been found. Most of koala sightings are in areas close to houses rather than in bushland areas away from houses and regular surveillance. Some park and bushland areas have been surveyed for scratch marks but most have not.
- b) It would seem to give a distorted picture by only nominating koala habitat areas near houses but ignoring the riverfront bushlands which have not been surveyed for koala signs. For this reason all areas likely to provide koala habitat in the Centenary suburbs have been listed and those with positive sightings and/or scratchings have been noted. This list may not include all possible koala habitat areas and further investigation is necessary.
- c) It is also probable that koalas move through people's gardens to access areas of bushland. It would be prudent to include residential areas between bushland and park areas in the koala habitat protection area.
